College Planning Guide

Senior Year

[Take off running and don't stop!]

 Focus on academics. Colleges will track your progress throughout your senior yearuntil graduation.
 Consider taking/re-taking the ACT/SAT.
Schedule meetings in advance with your college counselor for your college letter of recommendation.
 Request teacher letter(s) of recommendation in advance.
 Consider Early Action and Early Decision opportunities/commitments.
Finalize list of colleges, staying ahead of application deadlines.
 Write and refine your college essay(s)/supplemental essay(s), and possible personal statement.
 Update resume.
 Send your test scores to your colleges directly from ACT and College Board.
 Begin sending applications with help from the College Counselor.
 Schedule as early as September on Naviance to meet with college representatives who visit the Elms.
 Attend fall college fairs.
 Continue to visit and interview at colleges.
 Take the ASVAB (administered in October to all Elms seniors) to determine and match academic strengths, career interests, and college majors.
 Attend the evening Financial Aid program in September.
Determine if the CSS Profile from the College Board is required for selective colleges in addition to the FAFSA.

Complete the FAFSA, which becomes available October 1, and review its SAR (Student Aid Report) for accuracy. Be prepared for possible requests for verification.
Continuously search and apply for additional scholarships, including local, national, private, and college sources.
 Keep your counselor informed of all college admission and scholarship offers.
 Make final visits to colleges.
 Compare admission options and financial aid packages.
 Review curricula and the faculty who will be teaching you.
 Make final college decision by May 1st and secure your place with your deposit(s).
 Do well on the AP exams.
 Keep grades strong and behavior exemplary as your college admission and scholarships can be rescinded.
 Register for college orientation and remember to stay in touch. You will be missed!
