- **Honors British Literature:** *Pride and Prejudice, Brave New World*
- **College Preparatory British Literature:** *Animal Farm*
- I would like you to write your notes on post-it notes that you place in your book on the appropriate pages. When something very important occurs, or a character is introduced, write these details on the post-it. Ideally, write something at the top of the post-it, and include a page number or chapter number. Allow this part of the post-it to stick out of the book so you can access notes quickly. Besides plot details, here are suggestions for what you can write on the post-it notes; vocabulary and quotations can be written on post-it notes as well:
  - ✓ Character identification and descriptions as major characters are introduced
  - ✓ Questions you may have about plot, symbols, etc.
  - ✓ Occasional new words you needed to look up (at least five words per novel, not to exceed ten words per novel)
  - ✓ Quotations that seem important (at least five from each piece of literature, not to exceed ten per work)
- **This work is due on the first day of school. All sections of this assignment are important to your grade. YOU WILL TURN IN BOOKS WITH THE POST-ITS IN PLACE. FEEL FREE TO PURCHASE YOUR OWN BOOKS IF YOU ALSO LIKE TO UNDERLINE OR WRITE IN BOOKS. We suggest large post-it notes for this work**
  - **Special Bonus/Extra Credit Opportunity:**
  - Attend *Love's Labour's Lost* or *Twelfth Night* at Ohio Shakespeare Festival (at Stan Hywet Hall) and earn points for the first semester.
